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15:15- 16:00 **Panel discussion: The Hazards of Importing food with differing standards than the UK**

Importing food with lower standards than the UK poses significant risks. Much of this growth is coming from countries operating under different regulatory frameworks, where food safety systems may not match those required of British producers. Ukrainian eggs for example, which the UK is importing in increasing numbers, have been consistently linked to food safety issues across Europe in the last year. Public health is jeopardised by bacterial contamination banned additives, and growth hormones. Excessive antibiotic use in foreign farming also drives antimicrobial resistance. These products undercut UK farmers, who face higher costs to meet strict domestic regulations, potentially compromising long-term food security. Beyond the border – SPS reform and the future of food controls, what does this mean for EH? What are the risks and challenges?
